

How to hang a dressage bridle

This traditional method keeps the reins off the ground and the bridle contained in a neat package. Hanging all bridles in the same fashion makes for a neat, workmanlike tackroom.



With throatlatch and cavesson unbuckled, take the reins up behind the bridle.



Take the right side of the throatlatch, and cross it diagonally in front of the cheekpieces.



Cross the throatlatch behind the bridle, and pass it through the reins.



Cross the throatlatch diagonally in front of bridle, and buckle to the left side of the throatlatch.



Fasten the cavesson closed outside the cheekpieces.

If there's a flash attachment, fasten it above the noseband, to keep it from pulling the cavesson down.
